

Catholic Corner

There are three major phases in our human and spiritual journey:

Essential Discipleship – the struggle to get our lives together

This is our initial stage in life. Childhood is intended by God and nature to be a secure time. Puberty, sends us out restless, full of dreams, insecure in search of a new home that we build for ourselves. Normally, we do find our way home again, with a place to live, a job, a vocation and a series of responsibilities. This phase takes years leading us to the second phase

Generative Discipleship - the struggle to give our lives away

Most people reach this stage somewhere in their 20's or 30's. The struggle for self-identity and fulfillment never goes away completely; but, at a certain point, we begin to live our lives more for others than for ourselves. Generative discipleship begins then and lasts for a long time, our task being, how to give my life away more generously?

Radical Discipleship and the struggle to give our deaths away

Jesus gave His life for us in one movement and He gave us His death in another. He gave His life to us through His generative actions for us, and He gave His death through His passivity, through absorbing in love the helplessness and loneliness of dying. Like Jesus, we too are meant to give our lives away in selfless generosity and we are also meant to leave this earth in such a way that our death is our final and greatest gift to the world.

When we look at the demands of discipleship, we also realize that one size does not fit all. (R. Rolheiser – adapted)




