

ST. JOSEPH ORGAN COMMITTEE COMPLETES TWO TRIPS



The push for a new pipe organ for St. Joseph Parish began in 2006. Teresa Riley was the music director and Janet Marks was organist. A pipe organ fund was established, and the project gained momentum with plans, including drawings and tonal concepts, received by various builders. However, it was not God's timing and the project was laid aside. Then, in 2009, the

1949/82 Moller organ breathed its last and its pipes have been silent ever since, replaced by what was intended to be a temporary electronic organ with loudspeakers. Pray for God's favor in our endeavors. Nothing is impossible with God's help.

A list of 40 potential organ builders has been shortened to five: Buzard, Dobson, Fisk, Parsons, Schoenstein. To date, our organ committee has inspected organs from all but one of these five builders, traveling to Williamsburg/Richmond and Buffalo/Canandaguia Upstate New York areas. We also enjoyed touring an organ shop in Upstate New York. Our next trip is to New York City at the end of March, God willing, where we will inspect an organ from our final potential builder. Following that visit, our committee will invite no fewer than three of the five potential builders to visit Columbia with the idea in mind of developing and submitting plans for a new organ at St. Joseph. I'll keep you posted!

These e-mails are NOT COMING FROM MONSIGNOR HARRIS OR FATHER TOUZEAU. These e-mails are from FALSE e-mail addresses and are being sent to trick the recipient. Both Monsignor and Father send e-mails ONLY from their St. Joseph e-mail addresses:

Please pay attention to the email source – most of the fake e-mails are coming from a fake g-mail account, or another e-mail source that is **NOT** a **stjosephcolum-bia.org** e-mail address.

What is Phishing? Phishing is an e-mail or text message



that will attempt to trick the recipient into responding by sending money, sharing a password, PIN, or something of value (could even be parish checking account, credit card ac-

count or the parish e-mail and network account).

NO Confessions during the Holy Triduum NO Confessions on Holy Saturday, April 11

With the CDC deeming COVID-19 (coronavirus) a pandemic, we know there are many questions you may be receiving about what steps the Diocese is taking to reduce the spread of the virus. Below is our plan for the upcoming weekend.

As of now, state officials have NOT recommended or mandated that public events be canceled, but the CDC has encouraged the more vulnerable populations to avoid large crowds. Based on that recommendation, all Masses this weekend should go on as planned.

However, Bishop Robert E. Guglielmone is granting dispensation for Masses this weekend to those who are at high risk for adverse health complications from COVID-19, or do not feel comfortable attending Mass. The Catholic Catechism (2181) allows you to miss Mass as a result of illness.

Regarding Mass, Bishop Guglielmone asks that the following temporary precautions be made. It should be noted that these changes are only temporary and are being done out of prudence and charity with the greater good of the faithful in mind.

- Remove Holy Water from the hand-fonts, and if available, have hand sanitizer at all entrances.
- Remove missalettes, hymnals, etc. from the pews and consider one-time use worship aids.
- Suspend the exchange of the Sign of Peace or announce that it can be done with a simple bow. Also, no handholding during the Lord's Prayer.
- Suspend the distribution of the Precious Blood during Holy Communion.
- Saliva can be a very potent form of transmission of the virus. Given the frequency of direct contact with saliva in the distribution of Holy Communion, we highly recommend that distribution only be in the hand.
- Keep the gifts of bread and wine covered on the credence table -- no offertory gifts procession.
- Re-enforce procedures for having Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion sanitize their hands prior to and after distributing Communion.
- Priests be extra vigilant that all vessels used during Mass are properly cleaned after each use.
- If possible, during the collection, limit the number of hands touching the basket.
- Assure the faithful they are not obliged to attend Mass if they are sick and staying home can be an act of charity towards their fellow parishioners.

The CDC recommends the following actions to protect yourself and others from transmitting the coronavirus:

- 1. Stay home if you are sick.
- 2. Wash your hands often with soap and water.
- 3. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- 4. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- 5. Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- 6. Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue then throw the tissue away. If tissues are not available, cough or sneeze into your sleeve.


