Hearts Afire Retreats

Hearts Afire consists of two stages of retreats.

Stage one focuses on the Two Hearts. We

begin with the Immaculate Heart, because Mary leads us to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The journey to the Immaculate Heart begins with the 33 Days to Morning Glory group-retreat program.

Two sequences of 33 Days to Morning Glory will be offered. The daytime sequence will begin on Tuesday afternoon, April 26 at 1:30PM in the Gilmore Senior Center of the Ministries Building. An evening sequence begins on April 27 at 6:15PM in Donor Hall of the Ministries Building. This six week retreat includes independent reading, video talks by Fr. Gaitley, and group discussion.

The **stage two** retreats focus on wisdom and works of mercy. We begin Stage Two with The 'One Thing' Is Three and its accompanying group-study program. The purpose of Stage Two is to give group members a kind of crash-course in Catholic theology and to offer various opportunities, ideas, and support for works of mercy.

The "One Thing" is Three retreat begins April 5 at 6:15PM in the Ministries Building. This retreat discovers how the Most Holy Trinity explains everything. With humor and ease, Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC, deftly unlocks the "one thing," the key to the Church's wisdom, and the greatest mystery of the Catholic faith: the Most Holy Trinity. The 'One Thing' is Three makes deep theology accessible to everyday Catholics. An ideal resource for all who want to learn, love and live their faith. This ten week retreat includes independent reading, video talks by Fr. Gaitley, and group discussion.
