Called to the Fullness of Dignity

- Religious Freedom Week takes place June 22 29 each year. It begins with the feast day of Ss. Thomas More and John Fisher, includes the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, and ends with the feast of Ss. Peter and Paul. The theme for this year is Called to the Fullness of Dignity.
- The USCCB provides "Pray—Reflect—Act" resources at www.usccb.org/ReligiousFreedomWeek— one for each day on different religious liberty topics. These materials help people learn about religious liberty from a Catholic perspective, pray about particular issues, and act on what they learn by advocating for policies that promote religious freedom.
- The Pray—Reflect—Act resources this year show the range of religious liberty issues of concern to the bishops. The Committee for Religious Liberty has collaborated with the Office of International Justice and Peace to raise awareness about the <u>persecution of Christians in India</u> and the perhaps surprising number of people <u>who live under unjust blasphemy and apostasy laws</u>.
- Building on this year's <u>Annual Report</u>, the Week highlights concerns about <u>attacks on houses of worship</u>. There is no greater threat to religious liberty than for one's house of worship to become a place of danger, and the country sadly finds itself in a place where that danger is real.
- The Week also calls attention to threats to <u>Catholic ministries that serve immigrants</u>. In recent years, Christian services to migrants have faced vile attacks by both media personalities and political leaders seeking to make a point about current immigration trends. While debates about immigration and borders are simply part of American political life, the attacks on Catholic charitable services, which have led to threats of violence against the faithful and those they serve, have nothing to do with healthy debate. A nation that respects its religious institutions will recognize the Church's right to carry out her mission to vulnerable people, including migrants and refugees
- The attacks on both sacred spaces and ministries to migrants reflect the political and cultural polarization that has come to characterize so much of American life. Religious Freedom Week encourages Catholics do their part to promote civility by recognizing the dignity of all people and inviting others to do the same.
- This year, the USCCB Committee for Religious Liberty, in collaboration with the Secretariat of Catholic Education and Our Sunday Visitor Institute, hosted <u>a religious liberty essay contest</u>. The competition was open to high school juniors and seniors. This year's theme is "Witnesses to Freedom." Contestants were asked to share the story of witness to freedom—a story of the people who inspire us. The top essays from the competition will be published during Religious Freedom Week.

Cardinal Newman Organ Academy graduates three seniors

Since the Organ Academy's founding in 2018, six seniors have graduated from the Organ Academy. One of those students, Thomas Blake, a St. Joseph parishioner, has continued organ studies at the USC School of Music. Sometimes, if you turn around and look, Thomas will be seated at the organ.

This past May, we graduated three seniors, all of whom auditioned for USC School of Music organ studies and were accepted. Those seniors include St. Joseph parishioner Anastasia Egan, whom you have seen and heard in our Masses or seen assisting at the organ console. Adam Reisenauer is a parishioner at St.

Anne and St. Jude in Sumter. However, the family owns a second home in Columbia, and you will often see Adam at the organ playing or assisting. Brandon Mateo, a St. John Neumann parishioner, has assisted and played at St. Joseph Masses. This makes four out of seven seniors who have graduated from the Organ Academy, who are continuing organ studies in college.

One other young student who did not attend Cardinal Newman but is a St. Joseph parishioner, Nicholas Lanz, completed two levels of the Organ Academy curriculum and studied organ at Francis Marion College in Florence. He will leave for Germany in January and study organ while there.

There are two openings for Organ Academy students this fall. If you are the parent or grandparent of a Cardinal Newman student who has 2-3 years of piano experience, encourage them to sign up. Organ Academy students receive academic credit for organ instruction. Brad Cunningham, Organist


SUMMER OFFICE HOURS


