

HEARING LOOP IN THE SANCTUARY:

In order to access the Loop, a hearing aid must be programmed for the "T" setting, which can be done by a hearing aid specialist. When in the Church, the user can go to the "T" setting on their device and will be connected to the speaker system via their hearing aid.

Drive-Thru Distribution will be available from 3:30 - 4:30 PM under the overhang of the Ministries & Administration Building for those who viewed our Ash Wednesday Mass via livestream. Traffic cones will be set up to direct cars.

If attending the 7:30 AM Mass, please do NOT park in front of the church on Devine Street, as it will affect carpool for the school. Also please note that when parking in the MAB lot please use the crosswalks at the corner intersections. Parking in the school parking lot will ONLY be available for the 6 PM Mass.

ASH WEDNESDAY is a day of fasting and abstinence. On this day, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

ALL FRIDAYS of LENT are days of abstinence. Meat and poultry (i.e. warmblooded animals) should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

Upcoming Second Collections

Ash Wednesday - 3/5: Church in Central & Eastern Europe Aid to the Church in Central and Eastern Europe - to meet the needs of rebuilding the Church. It focuses on training seminarians and lay leaders, supporting social service programs, youth ministry, pastoral and catechetical centers, schools, church construction and renovation, and evangelization through Catholic media.

3/8 - 3/9: Black & Indian Missions

Mandated by the III Plenary Council in 1884, the 125-year-old National Collection for Black and Indian people continues as the embodiment of the Church's concern for evangelizing the Black and Indian peoples of the United States. The funds are distributed as grants to dioceses throughout the United States, supporting and strengthening evangelization programs which otherwise would cease. The Collection was formerly known as The Black and Indian Home Mission Collection.

For over 50 years, the diocese has served the people of South Carolina through parishes, schools, and ministries. While local parish support is important, it is equally vital to help the broader diocesan community. Gifts to CASC support Catholic schools, retired priests, youth ministry, outreach to the poor, seminarian formation, and college ministries. This is an opportunity to live out Christian stewardship by supporting the Church and those in need. The parish goal this year is \$113,525. Last year, the parish exceeded its goal by \$36,775.98 and received \$18,377.99 back. Only 55 churches out of 117 received money back, and we were one of the fortunate ones.


GILMORE LADIES GROUP WELCOMES YOU!

LUKER-MEYER SCHOLARSHIP

The Luker-Meyer Scholarship Fund, established in honor of Dr. and Mrs. Luker's parents, offers up to 50% tuition scholarships for children from our parish. This \$25,000 annual fund supports families seeking a Catholic education at St. Joseph School.

The scholarship is renewable each year, provided the child maintains satisfactory academic performance and the family meets need-based criteria through FACTS and the Tuition Parishioner Discount agreement.

Applicants must be active, practicing Catholics at St. Joseph Church. Families with children in grades K-6 are eligible to apply, with separate applications required for each child. Recipients are also invited to attend a back-to-school luncheon with Msgr. Harris and Dr. & Mrs. Luker.

RANSON-ABLE SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of William (Bill) F. Ranson III, Ph.D., a Professor of Mechanical Engineering who valued education, especially Catholic education, as a foundation for moral and academic growth. This annual scholarship fund will offer up to 50% in scholarships to eligible students of St. Joseph Catholic School, offering families with limited means the opportunity for a Catholic education.

Qualifications: This scholarship is for the 2025-2026 academic year, open to students in 4K through 6th grade at St. Joseph School. Families must be active, registered, contributing members of St. Joseph Church and meet financial need, demonstrated through the FACTS process.

A completed Tuition Parishioner Discount Agreement is also required. Scholarships may be received annually.
