# STAFF OPENING: ORGANIST

St. Joseph Church is seeking an experienced organist. This position would report directly to the Director of Music.

The organist is the main organist of the parish and is responsible for the execution of all organ music, including preludes, offertories, and postludes, as determined by the organist in collaboration with the Director of Music and

Pastor, when necessary. The commitment is for all Saturday and Sunday masses (currently 5:30 PM Saturday, and 8:00 AM, 10:30 AM, and 12:15 PM on Sunday), as well as Ash Wednesday, The Pascal Triduum, The Great Easter Vigil, extra Christmas and Easter Masses, Ordination, Rite of Election, All Saints, All Souls, First Communion, May Processional, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day Mass, Mass of Assumption, and any

other masses that may be scheduled. Candidates must have knowledge of and keep current on trends and directions of sacred church music in the Catholic church to assure all music used in liturgical services and special activities is appropriate in accordance with the church traditions as well as current practices and dictates of Church authorities. The organist position is a 30 hour per week position, salaried with benefits for 12 months per year. Biweekly compensation is paid to the organist.

The 5K start line is behind St. Joseph Catholic Church/School (on the corner of Bonham & Blossom streets). The race loops through the historic Shandon neighborhood and finishes behind the school on Blossom Street. The one-mile Fun Run is an out and back course that begins/ends on Bonham Street.

### 5K Pre-Registration:

- \$35 fee per person for 5K (regardless of age).
- All 5K runners will receive a race t-shirt if they register BEFORE January 4th, 2024.
- Runners who register after January 4th, 2024 are not guaranteed a race t-shirt.

### 5K Day-Of-Race Registration:

- \$40 fee per person for 5K (regardless of age).
- Race t-shirts are not guaranteed.

### One Mile Fun Run: (for children ages 10 and under)

- \$20 fee per person for the Fun Run.
- All who finish the Fun Run will receive a Finisher's Medallion and a t-shirt.

- Every five years ages 15 through 70 and older




# God's Doorkeeper
